As he travelled around the world to spread the sublime message of Krishna consciousness, he wanted the followers of this movement to imbibe a similar mood. Taking the words of Srila Prabhupada as divine orders, his disciples have invested their whole lives in spreading this transcendental knowledge for the whole world's benefit. Following the Parampara system, ISKCON's current leaders are also doing the same. But actual leaders are those, who create the next generation of leaders. Considering this ideology, the leaders of ISKCON Kolkata started a program called - Gour Bhakta Vrinda Sanga, which has been going on very nicely since September 2023. Till now we have completed four such sangas.

Anyhow, this is only a start. IYF Kolkata has planned to arrange these programs at regular intervals to encourage and empower the youths to build future leaders to take this Krishna Consciousness movement forward.


The voice has been opened so that youth preaching in colleges like Techno India & IEM could take place.



This was the vision of IIYC (ISKCON India Youth Convention) -2023, which happened in Govardhan dham. Obviously, in ISKCON, preaching or outreaching is the essence. By reaching out to the people, we inspire them to become devotees. But, it has been seen that to keep the devotees happy and inspired for years is even more difficult than just bringing them. And the most difficult thing is to generate the same missionary spirit within them, which is coming down in Parampara. When that same feeling of urgency awakens in a happy devotee's heart, he turns into a contributing devotee.

In the youth outreach program of our temple, we tried to focus on all three aspects, within our capacity. We are calling this approach generic growth, or creating an atmosphere where the devotees' natural desire to service sprouts and get nourished without giving them any pressure. Thus, they naturally become happy and contributing devotees.

Starting from a very difficult phase of having almost no devotees in temple-IYF, in 2022, we focused on recruiting devotees. Last year, our focus shifted to training and engaging the new devotees. Though, no IYF devotee has joined as a trainee brahmachari, many of them have joined different departments of the temple as sevaks, many of them have taken preaching batches and, many of them have taken voluntary sevas regularly, and in the festivals.

Two IYF devotees joined the Internet Outreach department last year. Along with that, the Deity department, Temple hall set-up department, Life-patron membership department, Nitya Seva department and Accounts department each have one devotee of IYF, as their Sevaks, last year only. Other than that, the Accounts Department and Book Distribution Department each have one intern from IYF. Almost ten devotees have taken regular backup services. Srila Prabhupada dressing every day and 7:30 am backup is completely managed by the Gauranga Bhavan resident devotees. Last year, eight IYF devotees started to lead DYS batches as preachers and many more have started to assist them. Now, all the festivals are supported by IYF volunteers only. However, in our biggest festival Ratha Yatra, we are yet to be self-sufficient but soon we are expecting to become. Boys are also taking voluntary sevas in book distribution, prasadam distribution etc. This year ICC has resolved that each of the temples is supposed to organise at least one Harinam Sankirtan a week. For the last year, IYF boys have been regularly doing this every Sunday evening. Lastly, the morning events like Mangal Arati and Gurupuja are always crowded by enthusiastically chanting and dancing IYF devotees. Thus,



EDITORIAL

Srila Prabhupada very clearly stated the purposes of ISKCON, at the time of founding ISKCON in 1966. Actually, Srila Prabhupada wrote the purposes, way back, during his effort to establish the "League of Devotees" at Jhansi. Almost all the purposes are directed towards the mass scale distribution of spiritual knowledge as revealed in the Srimad Bhagavad Gita and Srimad Bhagavatam and to establish a culture of this knowledge in the society. After establishing ISKCON, within 12 years, Srila Prabhupada himself, with the assistance of his young and dedicated followers, propagated this knowledge vigorously and almost incredibly, established 108 temples worldwide.

Therefore, we can see that Srila Prabhupada is the first "youth preacher" of our movement. He first tried to appeal to the educated Americans. Though they had appreciated him, they never committed to him. Finally, with utter desperation, Srila Prabhupada started appealing to the aimless, drug-addicted, music-lover hippies of America, who were the product of the 70's 'counter-culture.' In reciprocation, they not only hugely responded, but also many of them committed fully to Srila Prabhupada. And that's what becomes the reason for ISKCON's rapid growth. Though they were youth and inexperienced, they started to lead the movement in different countries, on behalf of Srila Prabhupada. Many others joined to assist these young leaders, just to please Srila Prabhupada and to be inspired by his writing and personal example.

One of the major things that differentiates ISKCON, from other spiritual organisations is the involvement of enthusiastic youths from 4:30 am to 8:30 pm, in all the activities of our movement. Srila Bhaktisiddhanta Saraswati Thakur has said, "One who has life can preach." And the youths have the life. Another consideration in this regard is that, in the spiritual world, everyone is eternally youth. Therefore, youths are the ones who can greatly relate to the activities in the pure spiritual domain.

In the present context of India, we are seeing that many youths are inquisitive about spiritual life. They are coming to the temple. They are asking questions. But, they will only commit to the movement when they see character and commitment in our own practice. Therefore, it is very important for us to guide the youth through the progressive path of spiritual life with love and affection and to develop a sense of responsibility for Srila Prabhupada's mission within them. The success of youth outreach is firstly, in its owning responsibility of all the programs of the temple and secondly, in creating an impact in the society at large.

In conclusion, the effort of the present IYF, Kolkata is to strengthen, structurize and grow the youth outreach throughout Kolkata on a far greater scale. We want to have our organisation to be active at least in every college and University in this city. That will automatically lead to the growth of the temple and a positive change in society in general.
